Oracy

- Pupils learn about the patterns and sounds of language through a variety of resources and activities.
- Engaging in conversations with staff and peers through asking and answering questions, expressing opinions and responding to those of others.
- Speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.

Literacy

- Reading carefully and showing an understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.
- Showing an appreciation towards stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.
- Broadening their vocabulary through the use of resources such as dictionaries.
- To describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing.
- To understand how to apply basic grammar and how to apply these such as feminine, masculine and neuter forms.

Intercultural understanding

- Pupils develop a greater understanding of their own lives in the context of exploring the lives of others.
- Pupils can look at things from another's perspective, giving them insight into the people, culture and traditions of other cultures.
- Describe the similarities and differences between peoples, their daily lives, beliefs and values.
